Notes on Friendship Mentoring Groups

Friendship Mentoring groups meet weekly over lunch. Guys meet with guys, girls with other girls. Most of the groups are monitored or led by teachers with student leadership coming from juniors or seniors. The purposes of the mentoring groups are to:

- challenge each other to put our faith into action,
- encourage personal prayer, Bible study, and spiritual growth, and
- hold each other accountable for maintaining Godly relationships with those around us.

Questions that are likely to be asked of students in mentoring groups include: Have you been consistent in your personal time of prayer and Bible reading? How can we pray for you? What has God been teaching you lately? What are some temptations that you face? Have you been honoring your parents this week?

While confidentiality will be stressed within the groups, it will be made clear to the students that no group can be completely confidential. If anything is shared that the group leader believes that parents must know (e.g. safety issues, illegal behavior) then the student will be encouraged to share this with his or her parents. If the student fails to talk to his/her parent, the parent will be informed.

The staff at FHCS is excited about our groups this year. We appreciate your kids so much and care about their growth both academically and spiritually. We want to assist you in helping our young people grow up to be who God wants them to be.
